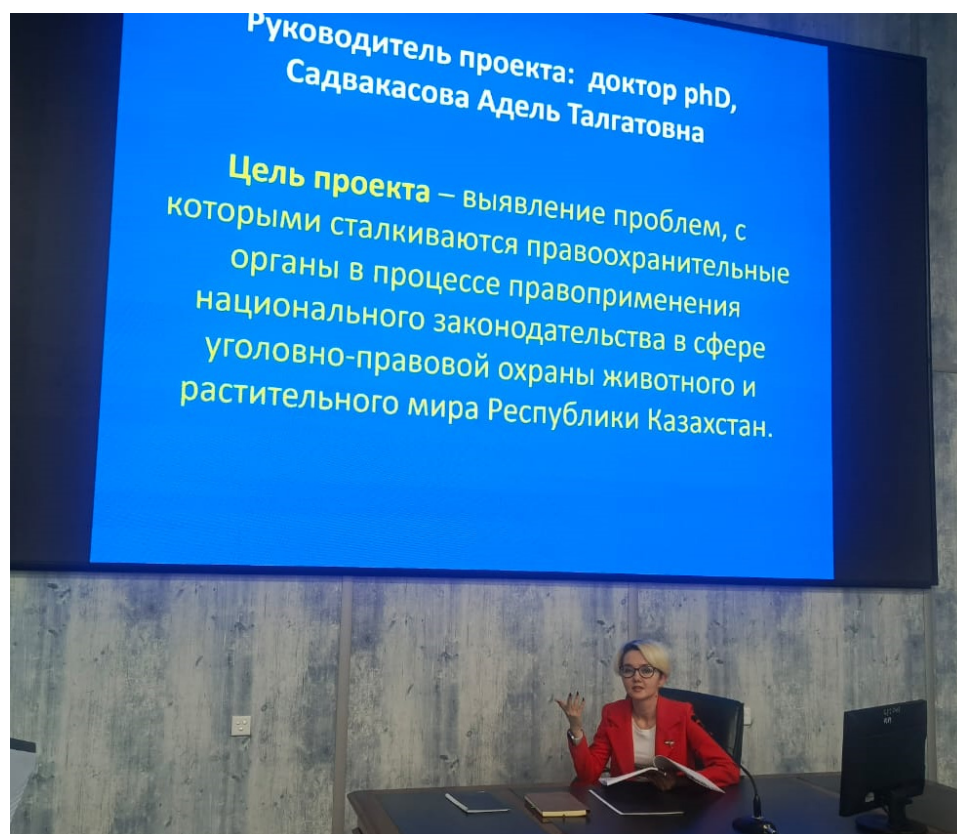


The Karaganda University of Kazpotrebsoyuz hosted an international round table on anti-poaching issues

On October 20, 2025, in the framework of the grant financing project AR27510473, in accordance with the calendar plan for 2025, an international round table "Protection of the animal and plant world of Kazakhstan: problems of combating poaching and their solution" was held at the Karaganda University of Kazpotrebsoyuz.

The event was organized by the Scientific Research Institute of Economic and Legal Research of the Karaganda University of Kazpotrebsoyuz. The round table was held in a hybrid format, which made it possible to bring together offline and online participants, representatives of the scientific community, practitioners, teachers, doctoral students and undergraduates.

A senior researcher at the Research Institute of Economic and Legal Studies of the Karaganda University of Kazpotrebsoyuz, PhD, Adel Talgatovna Sadvakassova, delivered a welcoming speech.



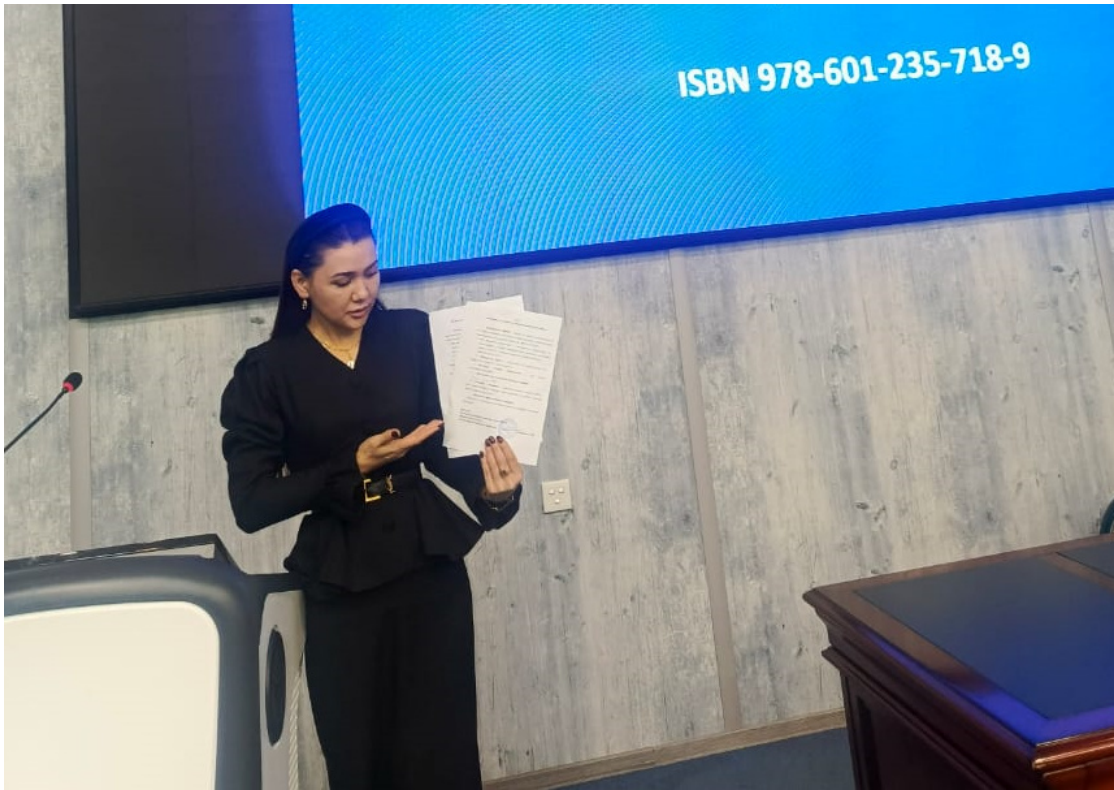
The moderator of the round table was Yerzhan Sapargalievich Abiev, Senior lecturer at the Department of General Legal Disciplines.

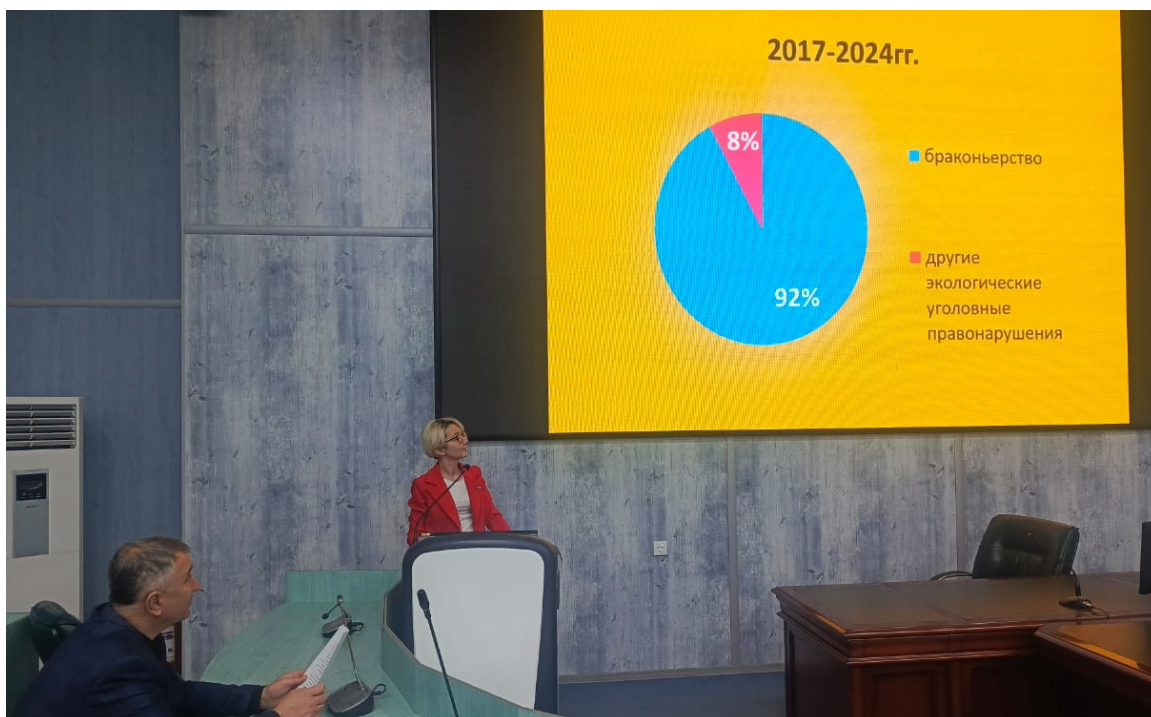


During the event, reports on topical criminal law, criminological, criminalistic, administrative, legal and organizational aspects of countering poaching were heard and discussed. Special attention was paid to the investigation of criminal cases related to illegal hunting, the characteristics of organized criminal groups in the field of poaching, the criminological portrait of the poacher, the role of government agencies and the environmental police, the use of unmanned aerial vehicles, as well as the problems of regulating the saiga population in the Republic of Kazakhstan.



The round table was attended by scientists and specialists from Kazakhstan, the Russian Federation and the Republic of Uzbekistan. The presented reports made it possible to consider the problem of poaching as a complex phenomenon affecting issues of biodiversity protection, environmental safety, law enforcement practice and interdepartmental interaction.





Following the results of the event, a collection of materials from the International Round Table was prepared, including scientific reports from participants and reflecting the main areas of discussion of the problem of protecting the flora and fauna of Kazakhstan. The collection is intended for scientists, teachers, undergraduates, doctoral students, students of higher educational institutions, as well as practitioners.

The round table became an important stage in the implementation of the grant financing project and contributed to the formation of a scientific and practical platform for discussing modern approaches to the prevention, detection and investigation of poaching offenses. The event confirmed the need for further development of interdisciplinary research, strengthening the interaction of science and practice, as well as improving the legal and organizational mechanisms for the protection of wildlife in Kazakhstan.
